

How to:
Make An Image Change When the Mouse is Moved Over It.

General concept:

To make an image change on your web page when the mouse is moved over top of it.

Specific steps:

1. Create the 2 images that you want to change, making sure that they're in the exact same location on their pages, and change them to a GIF in Graphic Converter
2. In script below, replace your file names with the one's given.

3. The Javascript section should be placed in the head element
4. lesson1 and 2 are variables being defined, and the .src shows what the source of them is from
5. The word in the NAME tag is important as it represents the name of the first .src in the OnMouseOver and OnMouseOut commands.
6. The rest is put in like a linked image.
