Create a Timed Page Change After Reload

General concept:

Using some basic Javascript, you can create a page load after a given amount of time. This basically means that you pause on a page for so many seconds and then are moved onto another page, much like a tour.

Specific steps:

1. By placing the following code in the <HEAD> command, you can determine what page you wish to load and after how many seconds.

```
<META HTTP-EQUIV="refresh" CONTENT="8; URL=x.html">
```

2. The value given to CONTENT is the number of seconds you want the browser to wait before loading the next page. This value can be changed to your own preference.
3. x.html is the URL of the next page you wish to load. Replace this with the URL or file name of the page you wish to load.

The placement of the quotations must be carefully noted. The quotations are opened just before the CONTENT value, and closed after the URL address.
